<u>CSBG Eligible beneficiaries</u> are the following: (1) all individuals living in households whose income is <u>at or below 200% of official poverty income</u> guidelines as defined by the United States Office of Management and Budget; (2) All individuals eligible to receive Temporary Assistance to Needy Families or Federal Supplemental Security Income benefits (under part A of Title IV of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 601 et seq.)), and (3) Residents of a target area or members of a target group having a measurably high incidence of poverty and which is the specific focus of a project financed under this chapter.

For programs that use CSBG to fund portions of salary or operating expenses, the persons served per the approved contract performance objectives must be at or below 200% of the poverty line.
