Program Budgets/Budget Narrative

Most grantmakers will want to see two budgets: one for the proposed project and your organization's annual operating budget. In this article, we'll assume you already have an annual operating budget and concentrate on how to develop the project budget.

The project budget should clearly indicate both expenses and revenue. Start preparing your project budget by taking an imaginary shopping trip: purchase whatever you need for this project and don't tie your hands by thinking too small. Have fun as you consider the possibilities.
