CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order at 3:02pm by board member Chair, Rich Webb. A quorum was present for the transaction of business.

Consent Calendar

- Review and approve the minutes of the Commission General meeting March 25, 2025
- Review and approve YCCSC's 2025 Organization-Wide Expenditure Report as of April 30, 2025
- Current balance/statement of financial position is \$2,643.56 as of May 22, 2025

MOTION: Vera Correa made a motion to approve the entire consent calendar, Andi Crivello seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

Organizational Standards and Informational items

- **Presentation/update from Child Advocates of Pacer, Yuba and Suter** – Amy Sugimoto, Kristi Varnum and De Anna Martin passed out a flyer with a program overview, services provided, current progress, etc. for Child Advocates for the group to review and reported the following:
 - Still working to expand into Sutter County
 - Marysville office is doing great with about 60 volunteers now.
 - CSBG funds assist with their Family Services program that works with parents to give them the tools to break generational cycles of poverty and substance abuse, gain life skills and education to succeed, be a better parent, etc.
 - Don't serve parents accused of physical or sexual abuse
 - Social workers love this program and consider it a game changer
 - Work intensely with each parent to determine and obtain "next steps" and consistently follow for updates on progress
 - Have Men only and Women only in person support groups as well as online support
 - Will possibly need to move to a larger location in near future

- 2025 to date, have served 12 parents with 24 kids resulting in the reunification of four parents with their kids (9 kids total)
- **Discuss Declaration of Intent to establish 9-member board** – Brynda Stranix reported that during CSD’s desk review, they again encouraged YCCSC to decrease the required minimum number of board members from 15 to 9 due to difficulties obtaining board members. The signed Declaration of Intent was submitted to CSD and is in the board packet for review.
- **Review and approve updated bylaws to be in compliance with Declaration of Intent to establish 9-member board** – Jackie Slade reported YCCSC’s bylaws have been updated to reflect the new 9-member requirement. Rich Webb asked the group to review the bylaws provided in the agenda packet with changes indicated in red ink. Group discussed.

MOTION: Renick House made a motion to approve the update bylaws, Vera Correa seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

- **Review CSD’s 2025 Desk Review Letter & Report C-25-060** – Brynda Stranix reported the results of CSD’s desk review monitoring are included in the agenda packet for review. Results were good, no findings, observations or recommendations.
- **Review Yuba County 2023-2024 Single Audit Report** – Group reviewed audit pages 14-15 pertaining to CSBG funding. Discussed that YCCSC is on a calendar year, while the County is on a fiscal year, which sometimes is challenging in reporting expenditures.

Committee Updates

- **Executive Committee** (Chair-Rich Webb; Vice-Chair-Carmen Rodriguez; Secretary/Treasurer-Dennise Burbank)

- **Ad-Hoc Committees**
 - **Site Review** (Kyle Heggstrom-Chair, Andi Crivello-Co-Chair, Vera Correa, Rich Webb, Carmen Rodriguez, Carolina Coronado Carrillo, Dennise Burbank, Crystal Mirabal, Renick House)
 - Jackie Slade reported the subgrantees will be emailed in June to request the completion of site visit questionnaires and semi-annual reports. Documents will be due July 31 with site visits to follow, typically scheduled in August/September.
 - **Community Action Plan** (Full Board)
 - **Surveys distributed/collected March-May**– Brynda Stranix reported 584 needs assessment surveys were returned from low-income clients and 176 were returned from community/service provider staff.
 - **Recap of Community Meeting Tuesday, May 13** – Brynda Stranix reported 23 individuals attended the 2026-2027 CAP Community meeting that was held at Hope Haven in Marysville. There were several new faces that had not participated before and provided good feedback and information on needs in the community.
 - **Public hearing /Special Board Meeting Tuesday, June 24 at 3:00pm at Hope Haven, Casa de Esperanza** – Jackie Slade reported she is preparing to advertise for the public hearing and post the notices in various places. The DRAFT CAP will be emailed to the board next week and will also be available on the YCCSC website page and at YCCSC’s office. She asked the group to review the DRAFT CAP and rank the priorities in preparation for the Special YCCSC board meeting/Public Hearing where the board will complete ranking and approve submittal of the 2026-2027 CAP to CSD.
 - **Due to CSD 6/30/25** - Brynda Stranix reminded the group the final 2026-2027 CAP will be due to CSD by June 30.

- **Strategic Plan (Full Board)**
 - **Staff Report on 2024-25 Strategic Plan Activities April/May 2025 update** – Brynda Stranix reported the staff report aligns with the Strategic Plan and provides updates for the last two months on programmatic activities by YCCSC management, service providers, other community efforts toward assisting the low-income and progress toward achieving YCCSC’s Strategic Plan objectives and key strategies.
- **Nominating (Rich Webb, Dennise Burbank)**
 - **2 Low-income and 1 private sector vacancy** – Rich Webb reminded the group of the vacancies. Jackie Slade reported she has been recruiting and advertising the positions but no applications have been received. Brynda Stranix reported Don Schrader has an interest in rejoining the board after a long hiatus- she to follow.
- **Allocation Committee (Entire board)**
 - Jackie Slade reported CSD has released 100% of YCCSC’s 2025 contract allocation. No word on if YCCSC will receive Discretionary funding.

NEW BUSINESS

- **Discuss future service provider presentations for July 2025 meeting** – Group discussed not having a presentation in July due to recent lack of board member attendance at meetings. Brynda Stranix reported Yuba County will no longer be financially supporting the running of the 14Forward homeless shelter in Marysville so Twin Cities Rescue Mission will be taking over management of the site. Currently the rules to entry of the Mission are very different than 14Forward so there will be a transition in services provided.

Possibly have the new Director of Twin Cities Rescue Mission present and provide an update at the September meeting.

- Jackie Slade asked and reconfirmed with the group their interest in having an upcoming board meeting at Linda Fire’s new admin facility. She to arrange.

MEMBER UPDATES –

- Vera Correa reported Alliance for Hispanic Advancement has partnered with a nonprofit to provide AI trainings from 4:30-6:30pm twice a week for six weeks. Yuba-Sutter area qualified as a community in need.
- Brynda Stranix reported Marysville Kiwanis Club, an organization that supports local youth in need, is hosting their annual fundraiser, Hogs and Hulas on September 28 at Sycamore Park. Campground reservations open soon.
- Andi Crivello reported Umpqua Bank in Marysville will have a ribbon cutting on June 12 from 11:30-1:30pm.
- Crystal Richards reported Johnson Park School summer school starts soon.

CALL TO ORDER

Called to order at 3:00pm by Rich Webb, YCCSC Chair.

LATE AGENDA ITEMS – None

PUBLIC HEARING:

Hold public hearing to give citizens an opportunity to comment on Yuba County Community Services Commission (YCCSC) DRAFT 2026-2027 Community Action Plan.

YCCSC Chair Rich Webb read the following from the Agenda: The purpose of the public hearing is to give citizens an opportunity to comment on Yuba County Community Service Commissions DRAFT 2026-2027 Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) Community Action Plan. Yuba County Community Service Commission is responsible for determining local needs and setting priorities for Yuba County's CSBG program. The basic goal of CSBG funding is to remove obstacles to enable low-income residents of Yuba County to achieve self-sufficiency. The Community Action Plan serves as a two-year roadmap demonstrating how CSBG eligible entities plan to deliver services. Testimony received will help determine the use and distribution of CSBG funds in 2026-2027. Participation of low-income residents of Yuba County is invited and encouraged.

YCCSC Administrative Technician Jackie Slade summarized information from the Staff Report provided in the agenda packet that explained every two years YCCSC does a needs assessment of the community so they can develop their Community Action Plan. Ms. Slade reported that multiple disciplines were used to determine the top needs of the area:

- Two Needs Assessment Surveys were distributed and collected in March–May 2025 to seek feedback on the community's needs. One from the perspective of the low-income and homeless (collected 584) and one from the perspective of community members, board members and staff of agencies serving the low-income (collected 176).
- Agency held a community needs assessment meeting on May 13, 2025 in partnership with Sutter County Community Action Agency to determine the needs/services of the low-income population. (23 in attendance, representing 17 different agencies) The top 4-5 needs from the low-income client perspective and the agency/community members perspective were discussed and analyzed.
- Feedback and input on the DRAFT 2026-2027 Community Action Plan is being obtained at today's public hearing
- In addition, YCCSC collected, reviewed and analyzed multiple agency needs assessment survey results, strategic plans and other documents to gain insight into the needs of the low-income population in Yuba County.

Reported the input and results from the above efforts were compiled, analyzed and condensed into the following top needs/issues as indicated in the DRAFT 2026-2027 Community Action Plan

- **Increase homelessness prevention and reduction services** (including financial literacy, childcare cost assistance, rent/utility assistance)
- **Increase affordable housing choices**
- **Expand access to health services** (including physical, locational, mental, behavioral, alcohol/substance abuse)
- **Increase living wage job opportunities and job/skills training opportunities**
- **Improve access to food and basic needs**

- **Enhance transportation and mobility assistance**

Jackie Slade inquired if anyone wished to address this issue, indicating that testimony received could help determine the use and distribution of CSBG funds.

- Twelve in attendance discussed:
 - Many of the priorities are the same as years past but have seen a rise of transportation and mobility as a top issue as well as need for more living wage job opportunities and/or training programs
 - HIGH need for behavioral health treatment options
 - PIT homeless counts showed lower this year due to more individuals being incarcerated (so not homeless)
 - Lack of education by those in need of all the resources available and how to take advantage of them

YCCSC Chair, Rich Webb closed the public hearing at 3:40pm.

- Group discussed at length and determined that although “Increase living wage job opportunities and job/skills training opportunities” is a high need, other agencies are already addressing this issue so YCCSC will not prioritize it.

MOTION: Renick House made a motion to approve the 2026-2027 Community Action Plan as presented, authorize signing of the CAP and prioritize the top needs in the following order:

- 1) Increase homelessness prevention and reduction services** (including financial literacy, childcare cost assistance, rent/utility assistance)
- 2) Expand access to health services** (including physical, locational, mental, behavioral, alcohol/substance abuse)
- 3) Improve access to food and basic needs**
- 4) Increase affordable housing choices**
- 5) Enhance transportation and mobility assistance**

Andi Crivello seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken on the priority position of each need, resulting in the motion passing unanimously.

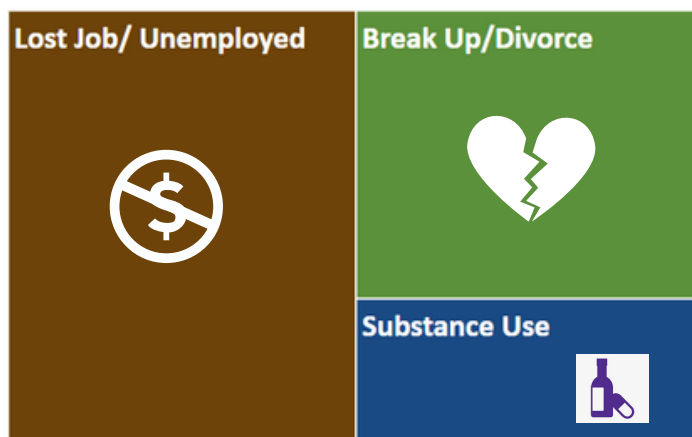

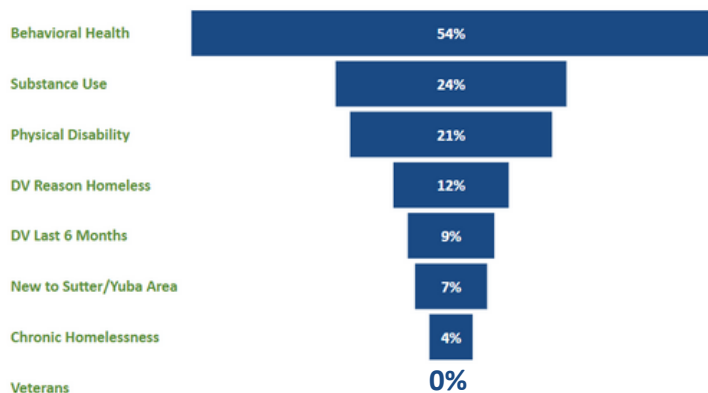

Community Action Agencies are designated and funded to reduce poverty in the communities they serve. Every service, activity, and role funded under Community Action must answer the question: "How does this move the needle on helping families out of poverty?"

Yuba County Community Services Commission (YCCSC) is tasked with maintaining a Community Action Board that operates to assist the low-income residents of Yuba County. The Board is composed of fifteen members representing three sectors: low-income, public, and private. Each member makes a commitment to represent the needs of the particular part of the community they represent.

NAME Donald Schrader
